National Voters Drive Coalition (NVDC) -Outcomes Report

We are officially in February 2023, less than two weeks away from the presidential and national assembly elections, on February 25. Anyone who has paid ANY attention and has seen the good, the bad, and even the ugly surrounding this election, but NPAG is **PLEASED** to report some of the not just good, but **GREAT** work that has been achieved under our engagement as part of the NVDC, the National Voter's Drive Coalition (a coalition of NGOs: NPAG, APHF, SHIFT Nigeria, RTLA, and P.A.Y and independent stakeholders).

As discussed in previous issues, the goal of this collaboration of organizations was to increase voter participation and voter awareness, and education in a non-partisan way; we are all collectively very pleased with the outcome of the work of this coalition and our partners on ground, and while election day draws so very close, we are all very aware that the work has just begun.

NVDC SPECIAL EDITION

PHASE ONE:

Phase One of our exercises under NVDC was centered on continuous voter registration exercises. During this phase, we focused largely on Abia state with the help of our partners, Progressive Youth Abia Youth (P.A.Y) on ground. Our decision to focus in Abia State was solely based on a very collaborative relationship that we established with INEC in the state, thanks to our very solid partners on ground. During phase one, we enticed potential voters to register for their permanent voter's cards (PVCs) by making blood pressure checks and medical screenings available to them for FREE.











RESULTS OF PHASE ONE:



126% increase in the number of voters registered in Abia State from February-May 2022



74,299 Voters added to the voters register in Abia State in 4 Months






PHASE TWO:

Phase Two of our effort was focused on PVC distribution and voter education. PVCs allow Nigerian citizens to vote, and in certain states and LGAs, large amounts of these cards are not collected. Given our success in Abia, we kicked off phase two exercises in Abia and also in Lagos. Phase two involved coordinating PVC distribution with INEC in Abia and briefly in Lagos in conjunction with medical screenings in Lagos. Phase two also included media and community outreach to educate voters on the need to pick up their PVCs and the importance of making their voices heard by voting. P.A.Y was again our lead partner in Abia and SHIFT Nigeria was largely in charge of spearheading NVDC's efforts to encourage PVC collection and voting in Lagos; SHIFT Nigeria's efforts included not only a successful radio tour but a Road Show to take our message to the streets.

RESULTS OF PHASE TWO:

- We helped INEC recruit more than 3,000 AD-HOC staff for the 2023 Elections
- Our Voter Education and Publicity flyers were translated into 3 major languages. Initial
 85,000 copies produced and circulated
- 20,000 "I WILL VOTE" stickers were produced and circulated.





RESULTS OF PHASE TWO CONT'D



88 volunteers mobilized and trained for PVC distribution and voter education (Abia and Lagos)





Over 27,000+ PVCs were distributed in Lagos and Abia State with this initiative



Our Market-to-Market campaign reached 20,000 people (Abia)



1,393 people medically screened in Lagos



Our Church-to-Church campaign reached over 4800 voters (Abia)



Over 100,000 voters were reached with our Media outings in Lagos and Abia



3 days-long Radio Tour in Lagos across 5 radio stations engaging in much-needed voter education

In phase two, NVDC with SHIFT Nigeria on ground coordinated a Lagos Road Show as another part of our voter education initiatives. Using entertainment to promote our messaging in Lagos, our partners with the support of the DEAN Initiative for entertainment, led the charge on the Road Show with the following goals:

- GRASSROOT ENGAGEMENT AND SENSITIZATION - Recruit 13 of our volunteers across the 3 LGAs in Lagos (Apapa, Mushin, and Ajeromi Ifelodun) to act as ambassadors and to engage with Lagosians; Door to door sensitization
- SOCIAL MEDIA ENGAGEMENT Volunteers share their experiences while volunteering and sensitizing people on social media
- ROAD SHOW/MUSIC Services of dancers and DJs to create awareness and get people's attention
