BACKGROUND

Election turnout in a typical Nigerian election is 15-35%; Ghana elections are typically 55-65%. Voter apathy is a major problem in the Nigerian political space.

In 2019 General elections, only 84,004,084 (42% of total population) registered to vote in a population of 200 Million people. What is more worrisome is the fact that out of the 42% registered to vote, only 28,614,190 (14.3% of the total population) voted.

In the Anambra 2021 Governorship election, only 253,388 (10%) voters out of 2,466,638 registered voters voted. The story has not changed.

It is this problem that National Voters Drive Coalition (NVDC) stepped in to solve. NVDC is a coalition of NGOs: African Primary Healthcare Foundation, Nigerian Physicians Advocacy Group (NPAG), Shift Nigeria, Ready to Lead Africa, The Compatriots and Progressive Abia Youths.

Our goal is simple: get as many people to vote in elections, particularly younger people. We are building a movement towards 2023 elections and beyond; one that will eliminate voter apathy and guarantee maximum participation during elections.

WHERE WE STARTED

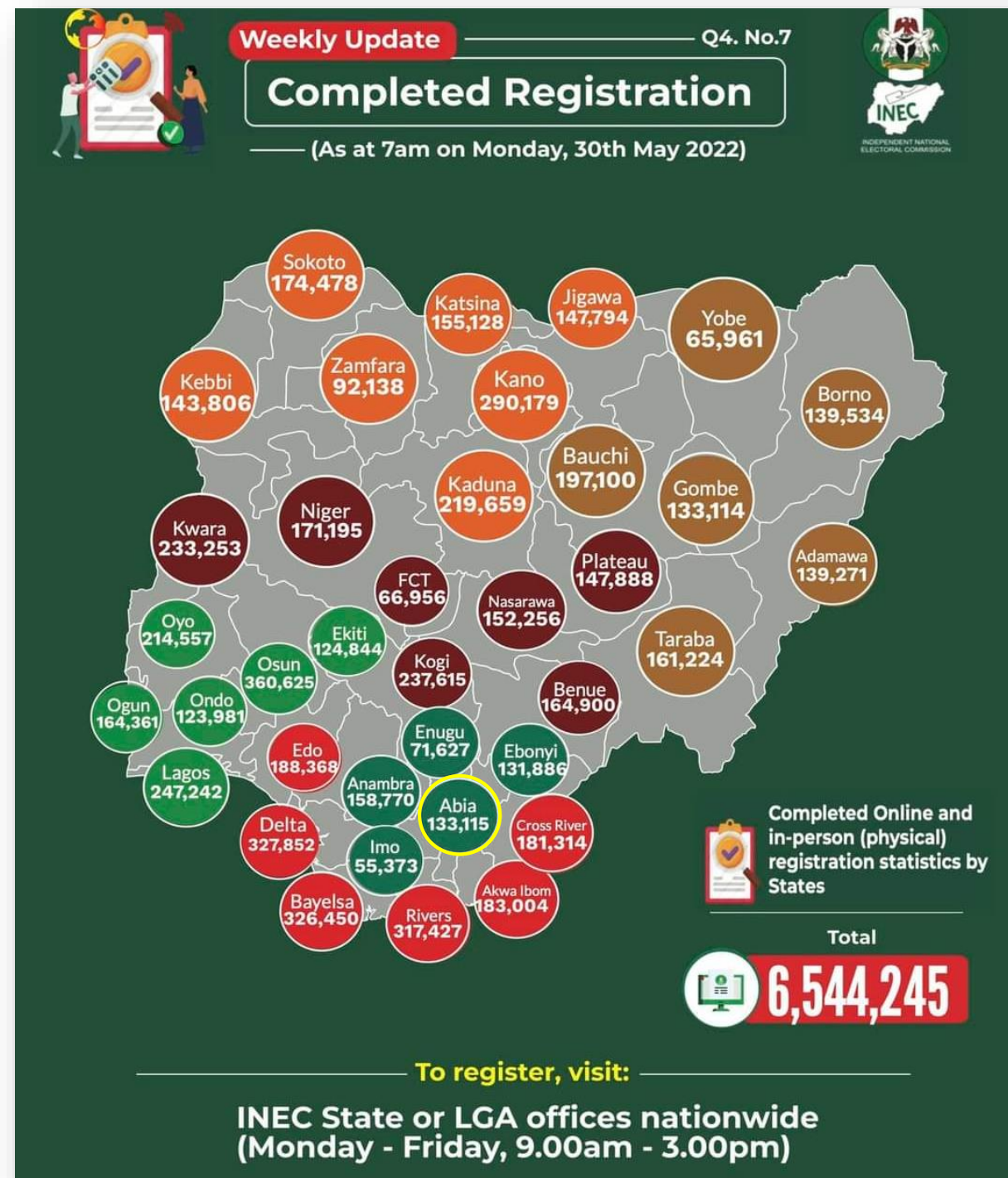
After 8 Months of continuous voter registration (June 2021 – February 2022), Abia had only 58,816 new registered voters

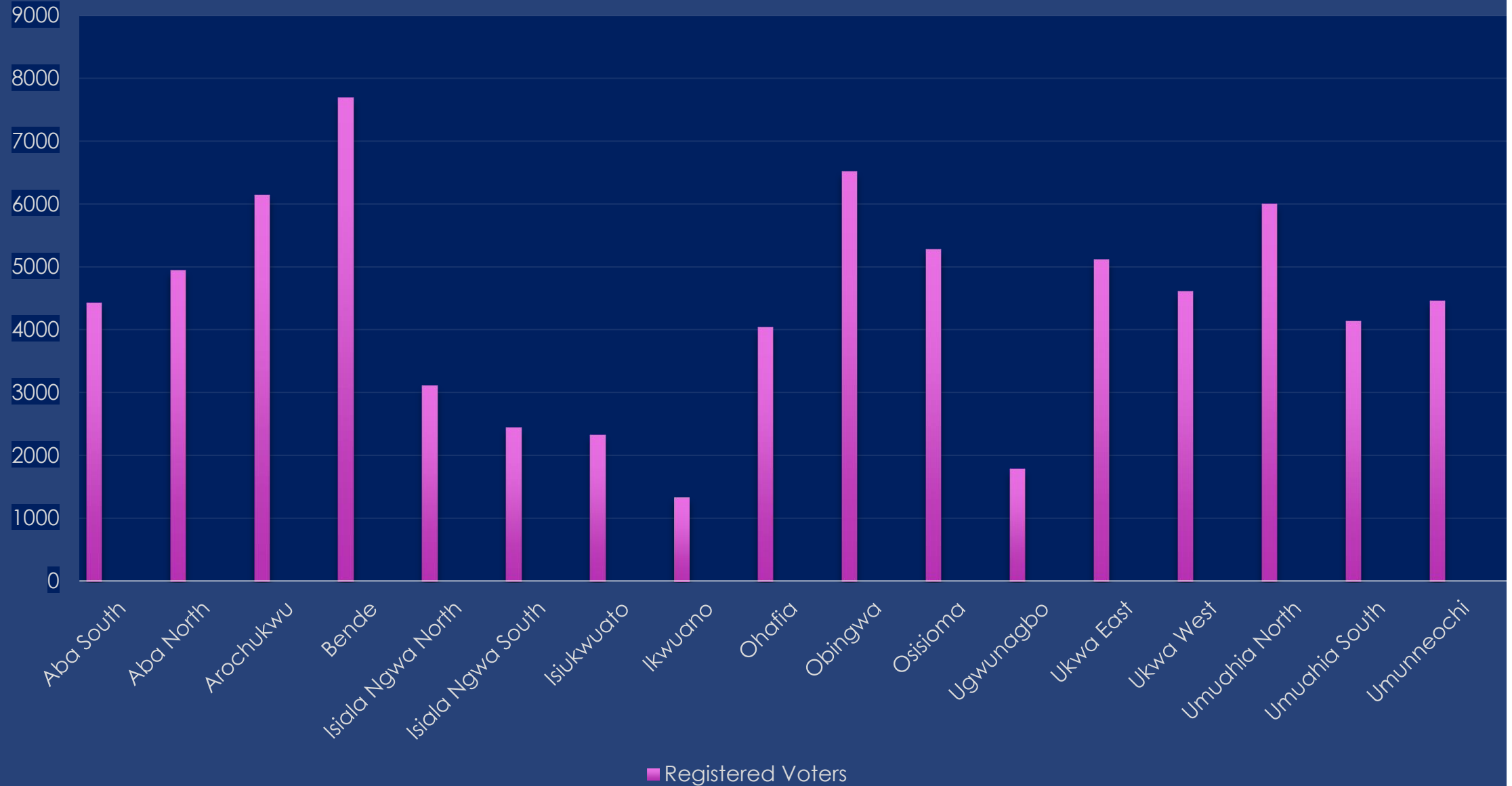

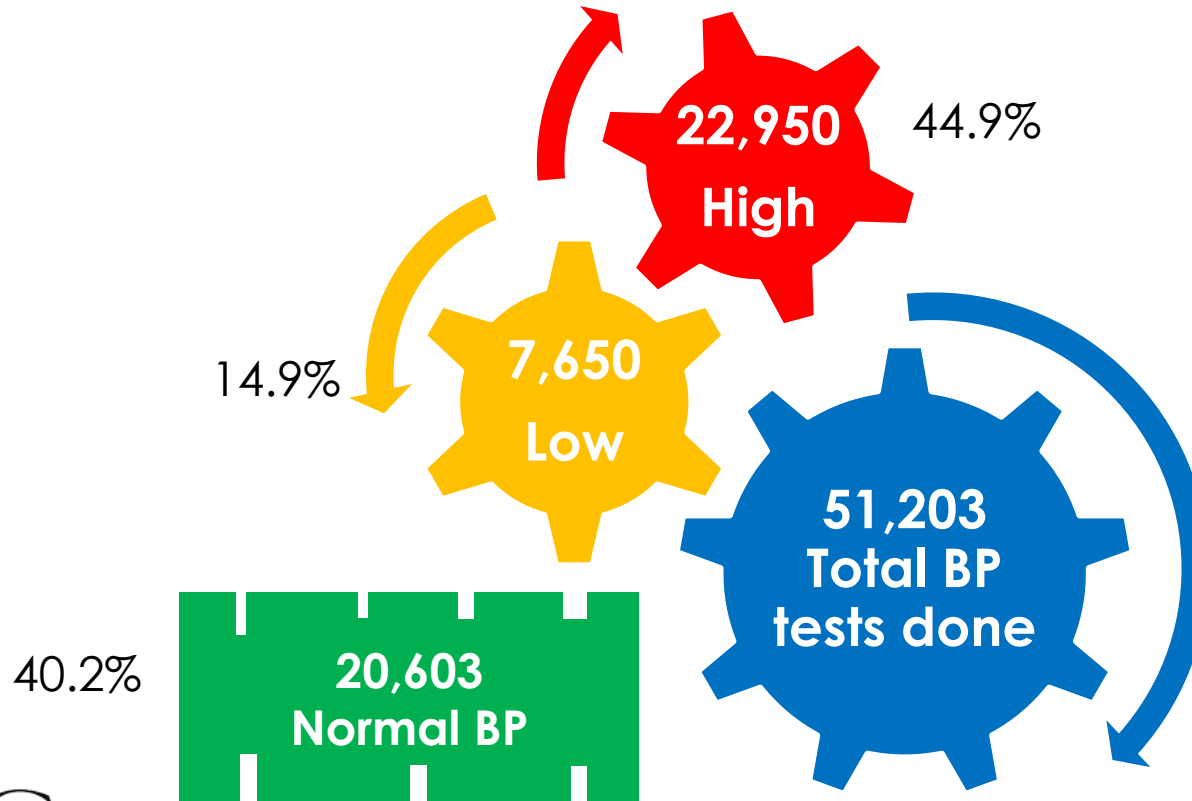

ELECTORAL ACT


HOW TO CAST VALID VOTE
STEP BY STEP GUIDELINE




No manual Accreditation.




No use of Incident forms




All accreditation is electronic.




Accreditation is Bimodal meaning facial recognition and fingerprinting.




No pre-election cases after the conclusion of Elections..




No election cases after swearing into office of the winner.




All results must be uploaded to INEC official website at the polling units before taking it to the ward, constituency, LGA or state collation center.



If the number of votes cast is more than the accredited voters the polling unit result is cancelled.



No more agreement between parties to share the remaining ballot papers that were not used.




No more massive thumb printing and stuffing of ballot boxes. If you like to go and steal ballot boxes you are wasting your time. You cannot change the result.


HOW TO VOTE

- Make sure you have a valid PVC
- Confirm your polling unit before election day
- Polling unit opens from 8am to 2pm on election day Arrive on time!!!
- As Long as you are in the queue before 2pm you can still vote

VOTING PROCEDURE:




STEP 1:
Join the queue




STEP 2:
INEC official will confirm your PVC is real and place your finger on the BVAS machine for accreditation

VOTE




STEP 3:
Once your PVC is confirmed your name will be ticked and your finger will be inked



STEP 4:
The Presiding Officer will stamp, sign and endorse your ballot paper, you will be given the ballot paper rolled with the printed side inward and directed to the voting cubicle

STEP 5:
Cast your vote with your fingerprint as above. Roll the ballot paper as it was given to you



STEP 6:
leave the voting cubicle. drop the ballot paper in the ballot box

YOUR RIGHT AS A VOTER
Access the polling station
Receive information on the voting procedures from the poll officials
Vote in secret.

RESPONSIBILITY OF THE VOTER:
Obey all lawful instructions from the INEC and Security Officials on election duty.
Wait for your votes to be counted and ensure that result from the Polling Unit is transmitted to the INEC server and pasted at the unit for everyone to see.
Encourage other voters to do likewise.

Step 7:
Wait, Watch and follow the process until results are declared

Lagos PVC Distribution and Medical Outreach





November – December Milestones

- Over 3,000 PVCs distributed in Lagos and Abia State
- 1,393 people medically screened in Lagos
- 20,000 stickers produced
- 88 volunteers mobilized and trained for PVC distribution and voter education (Abia and Lagos)
- Over 100,000 voters reached with our Media outings in Lagos and Abia
- Over 3000 INEC Ad-Hoc Staff recruited
- 85,000 fliers printed and circulated
- Strengthened our ties with INEC in Abia and Lagos States. Made initial contact with INEC, Kano State.
